I reached out to Officer Eliab to learn more about his tribe, the tribe of Zebulon. He had a lot to say about the scattered of the tribe; I will share parts of the interview here.

CI: I used *Who's Who in the Bible* to prepare for this interview. The Zebulon entry said that the tribe's name means dwelling. Why is this the tribe's name?

Ofc Eliab: The word dwell is important because according to the tribe's prophecy, we would dwell in certain conditions. In the past, we have dwelled in tents, and till this day we dwell by Issachar and by the sea.

CI: The 12 tribes chart lists the tribe of Zebulon as being spread from Guatemala to Panama. What countries does this include? Do you know if the tribe of Zebulon is found anywhere else?

Ofc Eliab: Guatemala to Panama refers to Central America. So some of those countries would be Belize, Honduras, and Nicaragua. Outside of Central America, there is a large population of my tribe in Bronx, New York.

CI: Zebulon's prophecy in Genesis 49 verse 13 mentions the words ship and haven together, twice. Why is that? What does it all mean?

Ofc Eliab: Those words are signs to show the prophets who my tribe is and where we would be found today. Zebulon will be found by the sea, working as fisherman or doing something that relates to the water. I'd say 80% of my tribe works in some way with the sea. Even if you were to go on a government ship, you would find Zebulon there. If you look at Cental America, where Zebulon is today, you will see that the area is surrounded by 3 bodies of water: the Pacific Ocean, the Caribean Ocean and the Atlantic Ocean. Wherever Zebulon is there is water and many ships, just as the bible says.

#### Ingredients

#### Tortilla

- 2 c all purpose flower
- 1 c water
- ½ c vegetable oil
- 1 egg
- ½ tsp salt

#### Filling

- 2 c refried beans, warmed
- 1 avocado sliced
- ½ c crumbled queso fresco
- ¼ c crema fresca
- 2 eggs

#### Directions

-Mix flour, water, vegetable oil, egg, and salt in a large bowl. -Knead until dough is smooth and no longer sticky.

-Form the dough into 8 golf ball-sized balls. Cover and let rest, 20 min

-Stretch each ball of dough into a thick tortilla.

-Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Cook each tortilla until browned and lightly puffed about 1 min per side.
- Scramble 2 eggs

-Layer refried beans, avocado, eggs and queso fresco over tortillas. Drizzle crema on top; fold tortillas in half over filling
