Gentleness: Be kind and show yourself friendly. (Proverbs 18:24)

Goodness: Do not treat your lord evil. (Proverbs 31:12)

Faith: Believe that TMH's word is true and that goes with your marriage. Do not give up on your lord. (1 peter 3:6)

Meekness: Submit to your lord in everything even if he is wrong. (Ephesians 5:22)

Temperance: Control your spirit. Your thoughts become your words. Your words become your actions. Proverbs 25:28



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
