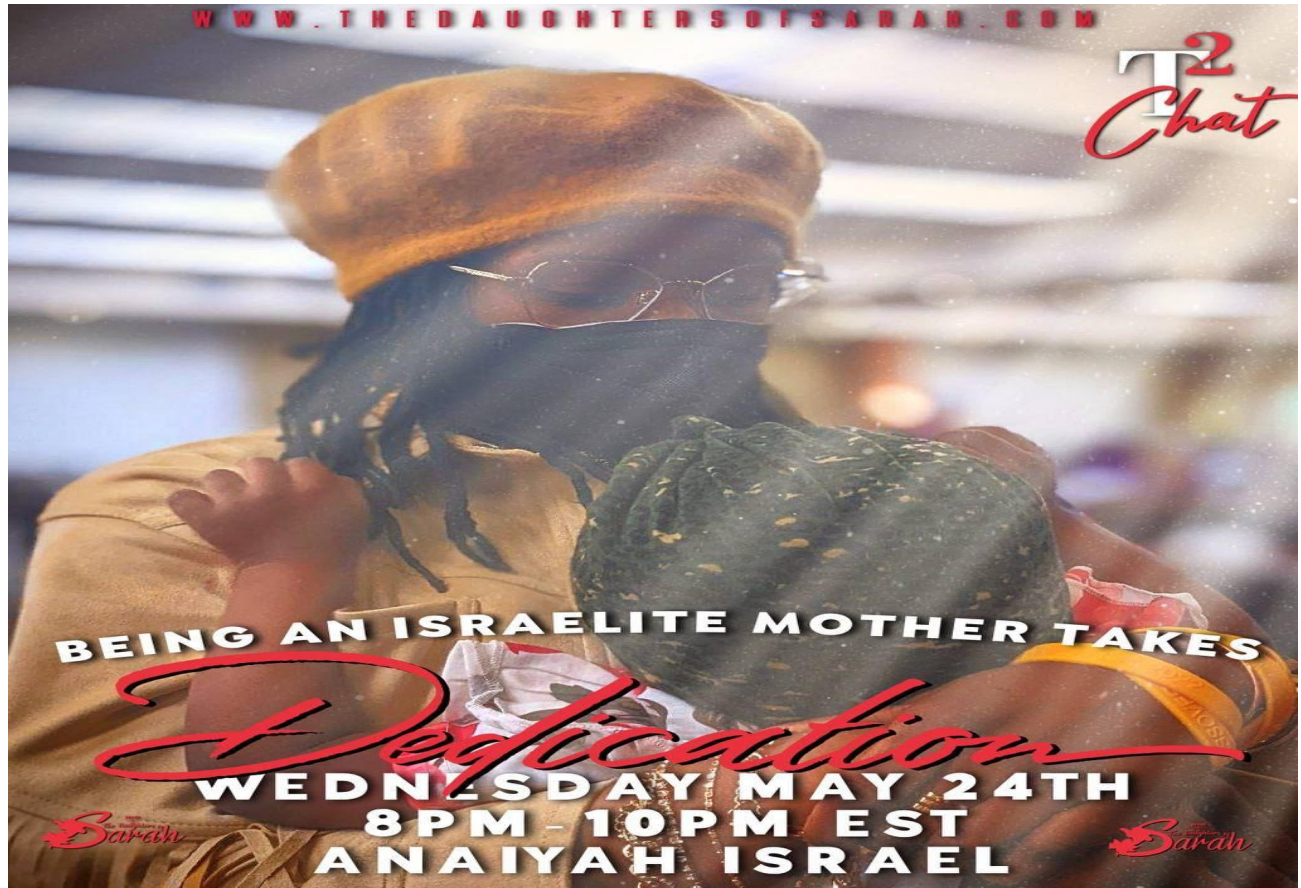


Being an Israelite Mother Takes Dedication Pt. 2

There is no compromising this is what is required of us to have all these traits.

Psalms 127:3 Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward.

Whenever we receive any gifts, it does not have to be your own child. We cherish it, and take care of it to show we are grateful. This is the same thing, the Most High has entrusted these children in our care. We have to do everything in our power to make

sure we are raising them up thus saith the Lord. We must do the best we can whether we gave birth or not, it takes a village to raise the children.

Anything we are looking to find in the scriptures is here, we know as we came through captivity we were always together. We have to be together and help one another. Everything written in the Bible is written aforetime so we can read them, learn from it and apply it in our life and if we do it we will have hope. One thing that was written aforetime is raising children. They are our future. We have to spend the time to raise them properly, in the truth." -Captain Gideon

My lord tells me it is really important you do this. These children depend on you, we share stories about our upbringing. He encourages me, supports and exhorts me. It is not a game and it's not light to have children and be lax with it. I will be sharing clips about what could happen if we don't take this role seriously. We want to get out of here, ultimately. If we have an input to raising the next generation we have to do it to the next generation. If we mess up it can be a stumbling block for us to make it in the kingdom. These children matter to the Most High and we have to show Him that they matter.

Behavior is correction. Punishment is teaching it is spiritual because God does this with us. We must obey and if we don't listen there are consequences. The same way they have to listen is the same way we have to listen to the most high. You can start teaching the order early. The scripture says we have to teach them day and night, any opportunity we have to teach we have to implement as early as we can. There are consequences if we do not follow the rules.

Leviticus 26:14 But if ye will not hearken unto me, and will not do all these commandments; **15** And if ye shall despise my statutes, or if your soul abhor my judgments, so that ye will not do all my commandments, but that ye break my covenant: **16** I also will do this unto you; I will even appoint over you terror, consumption, and the burning ague, that shall consume the eyes, and cause sorrow of heart: and ye shall sow your seed in vain, for your enemies shall eat it.

This is a scripture my lord brings out there are consequences to actions, if we aren't doing thus saith the Lord, it's going to be judgment. The children are not exempt. This is a scary thing. The whole objection is to keep the commandments, we want to do our best to walk upright to perfect our walk. Make sure if we mess up, we recognize, own it, and apologize and do better. We cannot do the same thing and keep coming back asking for forgiveness and there is no change. If our children are doing that, what is that telling us? They are rebellious. No one wants The Most High to take wisdom from us. We can't just decide to be a wife and not a mother, or mother and not a wife, or a sister for leadership and you don't care about the children or mom in need. If you did have children, the shoe was on the other foot. Would you want that to be done to you?

When it comes to behavior, children learn what they see. We are to be an example to our daughters and young daughters in the congregation. How they should walk, talk, sit, and answer if someone is calling them. It is not comely if a child answers with "what" . It is not shamefaced, it is not polite, we have to be mindful of the way they sit, dress, and eat. Every single thing we have to be on top of it. We have to make sure everything is on it. It is easier to correct it in the beginning versus allow it to grow. We are examples of what our sons will be looking for in a wife. Everything matters. It all matters.

Let this sink in and set in. This is an outcome, this is real life. A lot of us came from the world, seen family members and friends go through this. This is really happening and it is real life. This is a visualization of what children are watching. Children are paying attention to the smallest things. This is painful, we need to fight like hell to make sure this never becomes us. We can destroy a child's soul. Boys look up to their mothers like they are the princess. He said mom fix your crown stop looking down at me. If you do something wrong, you can't look them in the eye. He said mom fix your crown, we are supposed to be daughters of Sarah this can't be us. We can't allow our children to see us fight with our lords. As a single mother, you can't be fighting with the children because you're mad at their father. The Most High brought these children into your life to save your life. You have to have faith and do your part. Do not take it out on your

children, it is not their fault. The Most High is not pleased with us if we roll in this spirit. If the marriage is not where it needs to be, you then resent your children. You can't hide it and fake it, they can sense it; they came from you.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

It is a choice to take someone on in an argument. You can choose to answer peacefully or exit peacefully. You know in your spirit if your next sentence is going to lead to that person to argue. Because your pride is hurt and angry, you are not considering you have kids watching in different rooms. The scriptures say humble yourself greatly and I will exalt you. You have to take one for the team. Sometimes you have to let them speak and walk away. Deal with it at a time when the kids are not home and you can bring it up peacefully.

Children should feel safe at home. What kind of example are you setting? You are acting real fake with fringes and a border of blue. We are supposed to be virtuous women, or aspiring to be. My husband may be upset, I say ok I understand. I am not going back and forth so my children can feel unsafe. Like the young man said, what kind of example am I setting to my sons if I'm jumping in their father's face? The example you're setting is, it's ok to pick a woman that can do that. You can ignite the flame or put water on it with your words. "My lord I notice you're really upset, and when you're calm, I do want to hear what you have to say, but maybe we can wait until the kids go to bed". You have to be eloquent in your speech and lady like. Everything is not fight, it is evil, be mindful as you're reading these scriptures, you have to become that new woman in Christ.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon:

Suffer yourself to be defrauded, The Most High is going to fight for us, you have to have faith and believe it. Wine excessively is a problem, this cannot be a representation of how we are to be an example in this world. He said "only cooks when he's around" . We should not be operating like that. He said, "only cleaning when you know you have company". If someone comes to your house without a warning, is your house in disarray? He mentions yelling. Some of us; I'm not exempt, we yell, that's a resort to punishment. Sometimes you just yell, but I had to check my spirit. I don't want my daughter to be yelling. Kids mimic everything they see. It is important we understand this. This little boy mentioned you are always yelling and not sitting down talking. You can still convey the same message as opposed to yelling. That should not be the go to method for everything. We have to care for these little spirits, nourish and cherish them to the best of our ability.

Ezekiel 16:44 Behold, every one that useth proverbs shall use this proverb against thee, saying, As is the mother, so is her daughter.

If our girls are displaying behaviors not ok, it is our job to drive it out of them and stay on top of it. At the end of the day, spiritual men and women will look in and wonder who did she learn that from, where is she watching that from? No matter how much you try to wrap your head wrap, at the end of the day, if your daughter is being wild, out of order, rude, nasty, that is going to come back to us. Sometimes our children learn behaviors from their dad. My daughter used to be very bossy. I do have a problem with my daughter acting like she can boss me or other little girls around. So everytime I witness that, I redirect. I will be on top of her to make sure that spirit does not come back up.

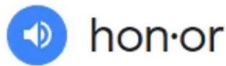
Proverbs 22:15 Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child; but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him.

It's guaranteed they will do things, push the limit, explore and see what they can get away with. It's bound in them, it is going to happen. With us knowing that; we have to understand everything we are learning, we have to practice and put into application. When we have to get the rod, we have to. When you put it off it will only grow larger. It is better to catch it when you see it opposed to let it fester and grow.

When you're looking for ways to teach your children. We go over commandments in the school, yet it is important we instill this in them.

Exodus 20:12 Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.

Our children must honor us. It's a commandment. What does honor mean?

High respect. Great esteem. High regards; with great respect. We have to make sure our children are honoring their fathers, mothers, leadership in the body, respecting any adult over them, even if they have an older sibling.

I tell my daughter, she is starting to read and write, so she can get that inside her spirit. Just like you have to honor me mommy has to honor The Most High, that's our heavenly Father, If we want to live a long life we have to honor and obey him. All the words in this Bible, this is what we have to do. Sometimes it's not what mommy says, it is what Most High says. You have to repeat this, it is not an easy feat, but it has to be done. Sometimes I want to be quiet, when you have children it is not a luxury to not just talk.

The parents' job is to teach their children to sit down and listen. Your at home, that is your job, it is not the church's job. Some children it is hard to have them sit down, that is the mothers job. You wonder what your role is, this is your role.

This is our role you have to take. No matter how repetitive it becomes, when we have a role to do, it has to get done; period.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

A lot of mothers say my child is young, they can't sit down. Some sisters are not coming to class. You have to train your child at home. Put on classes at home and tell them not to move. Have them sit five minutes, ten minutes, let them know, until you build them up. If you never start training them, then they will embarrass you. Make sure you start somewhere. It is not that they have ADHD it is because you never train them at home. Someone is at home letting them know it is not a game. Make sure as mothers, that is a part of your job, to train your children to sit and have self discipline; to be quiet. Eventually it is 3 hours and after a while they get used to it, and start doing it naturally.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon:

When kids are at a toddler stage, start at home. In order for your child to stop being wild. Place them in a play pen, before they get into the chair. At first the baby might cry, but they are safe. You have all they need, toddler friendly toys, all this matters, it is teaching and training them not to be too wild. If you see them, increase the time and talk to them. If they cry it is ok, they are safe. There are different alternatives to start training our children from young, a play pen, a crib, a high chair.

It is not up to the school to do it. We should not be waiting for the Sabbath day. On the Sabbath day, if they don't have training, it won't flow. We have to have consistency. Repetition is how they learn. We have to make sure we are not relying solely on the school, teachers and sisters. It does take a village, yet, it is not their responsibility; it starts at home.

Sirach 30:9-13 Cocker thy child, and he shall make thee afraid: play with him, and he will bring thee to heaviness. 10 Laugh not with him, lest thou have sorrow with him, and lest thou gnash thy teeth in the end. 11 Give him no liberty in his youth, and wink not at his follies. 12 Bow down his neck while he is young, and beat him on the sides while he is a child, lest he wax stubborn, and be disobedient unto thee, and so bring sorrow to thine heart. 13 Chastise thy son, and hold him to labour, lest his lewd behaviour be an offence unto thee.

This is heavy. If we are moms, sisters, if we want to be future mothers, all these scriptures are good to have in our spirits, arsenals, and precept books. Cocker thy child and he will make thee afraid. There is a time and place for everything. Sometimes we play so much, they look at us like we are their friends. After a while of playing, I need intervals. You have to make sure, there is a time and place for everything. You play so much with a child, they start to lose respect. When it comes to playing we have to make sure our children are being kind, sharing, not outdoing or competing with one another. I


tell my daughter to look out for her brother and we have to teach them to be unselfish. All these behaviors have to be taught and do not come naturally.


1 Corinthians 12:12 For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ.

The body is one body, speaking the same thing, and all the members are one.

Philippians 2:3 Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves.

This is how we are to be examples to children and make sure we are not doing this. As the children are watching us, we have to be an example. Some people have vainglory, it is a terrible thing to have. The Most High says, let nothing be done through strife and vainglory.

Vainglory-Some people have excessive feelings that you are better than other people.

Excessive, unreasonable, unwarranted, extreme, outrageous, extravagant, unrestrained, unlimited, over the top. Let nothing be done this way is what The Most High says. That is a spirit saying I am outshining my sisters.

We are supposed to esteem each other. Don't say I'm the best. You did a great job, we all did a great job. We have to make sure when we speak not to have a vainglory or striving spirit. We have to learn to say we all did a great job.

A perfect example of that was at the Passover, when Mother Paryah showed us an example of giving honor to everyone. You need to learn how to make your sisters feel included and loved. We need to stop competing and be examples. Our children are watching. What are you thinking the children are going to do? We need to cut this ugly spirit of vain glory and do what The Most High says.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon :

That comes with exhorting one another.

1 Corinthians 12:12 For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ. 13, For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit. 14 For the body is not one member, but many. 15 If the foot shall say, Because I am not the hand, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body? 16 And if the ear shall say, Because I am not the eye, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body? 17 If the whole body were an eye, where were the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where were the smelling? 18 But now hath God set the members every one of them in the body, as it hath pleased him.

We all have to have the same spirit. It is not for you to say, I'm the best. It is not about you, about one person, it is many of us keeping this thing going. Everybody was necessary to get that bathroom clean, we have to learn to speak life into each other. Think of a body, can your feet tell your hands, I don't need you? Hands do a totally different job. The hands cannot tell the feet, I don't need you. The point of this scripture is to say every part of the body that God gave us is necessary. He's telling you, just how you need your ears, the eyes to see; everyone is necessary.

This spirit of vainglory needs to stop in Israel. Each sister is important, everyone is of value. We all keep this machine running, this is the Most High's business. This is not a me thing, all of us are important. Get it in our head, to love one another as we do

ourselves. We need every part of the body, as we need every sister that The Most High sent in.

Who sent them in, the body; God. How are we to devalue them? He said I sent them in, don't put them down, even if she's a singer. She did not come to sing for you, dancing, people in the play, it is not for you to say they are not necessary. Be very clear who sent them in. When you're chasing them out, the angels are writing it down for judgment day. Let's be clear, as we all have to speak the same thing.

Proverbs 27:1 Boast not thyself of tomorrow; for thou knowest not what a day may bring forth. 2 Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth; a stranger, and not thine own lips.

Do not boast, do not brag of the things you have. That is not appropriate. You don't know if she has food. You don't know if tomorrow you will have it. The Most High can take it in a second. All we are to do is to tell The Most High thank you and use it to help one another. It is not a me and I program. Make sure we are clear of how we move as sisters. If you don't have something nice to say, be quiet. We are not in the street; this is The Most High business. Let someone else give you praise. It is an evil spirit and we need to get rid of it in Israel. Even if it is a stranger, let them praise you; not your own lips. Sometimes it makes others feel belittled. Everyone is important, because God has put them where he wanted them.

1 Corinthians 12:19 And if they were all one member, where were the body? But now are they many members, yet but one body. 21 And the eye cannot say unto the hand, I have no need of thee: nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you. 22 Nay, much more those members of the body, which seem to be more feeble, are necessary: 23 And those members of the body, which we think to be less honourable, upon these we bestow more abundant honour; and our uncomely parts have more abundant comeliness. 24 For our comely parts have no need: but God hath tempered the body together, having given more abundant honour to that part which lacked. 25 That there should be no schism in the body; but that the members should have the same care one for another.

If it was all about you, where will the rest of the body be? Where would their roles be? You are a good counselor yet not a good cook, how will we clean up after? Every person's role is important. We may have 100,000 members, yet it is one body, one mindset, we are all trying our best. We can't tell each other, we don't need her. That is crazy; you devalue her, even in your mind. It will go in your actions and words.

The Most High say the people you might deem most feeble, He says they are necessary and it is not for you to decide. That is not what we are doing here as sisters. You may think that person is less honorable, we are to honor them too. Why are we thinking they are not important? In here we love one another as we love ourselves.

Who put it together? God put every sister, every brother, where He wants them to be. It is not for us to say someone does not matter! Everyone matters because He gave them the gift. Let them do their job and exhort them. Learn how to open your mouth with kindness. It is an ugly spirit of vain glory. He said do nothing at all through vainglory.

There should be no divisions, it makes other people feel low. I don't want no schisms in the church. All of our talents are to be used to glorify God, not ourselves.

Have the same care for each other. Make sure we are not setting an example of fighting and arguing and vainglory. When does serving God become a competition? Where is that spirit coming from? The Most High is telling us through the scriptures, that spirit does not come from me. Compliment others better than yourself.

You don't tell them to "do it cause I told you". You tell them, we were slaves here, you need to instill that fear. If you don't listen you gone die. If the child is small enough to do bad, why can't he be small to learn good things? Where did the child learn the behavior? The parent says they are too little. My parents taught me to say hello. After two or three slaps, I learned to say hello. You can teach that child to be hospitable. The mother made them that way and the father didn't care.

We can teach that behavior at a small age.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

Your children start doing this. They will grow up and be nasty and mean. Your example as the parents, what are you teaching these kids. You will not get in the Kingdom with a vain glory spirit. If we tell them and not do it ourselves that is hypocritical.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon:

Let your light shine, they have to see you do right and they give glory to the Father. You have to be on top of it, when you see it, you have to drive it out. You see this in you, you have to fast it out. These kids are watching you. I believe children are important. It is important we get a grip on this and do better.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

Yezeel would always correct my younger daughter, she would show my daughter the scriptures. It is important; if my oldest daughter didn't teach her this, she would not have known. If you don't have that in you, your children will copy. What are you teaching them through your speech and behavior? Make sure you are teaching and being a righteous example.

2 Kings 2:23 And he went up from thence unto Bethel: and as he was going up by the way, there came forth little children out of the city, and mocked him, and said unto him, Go up, thou bald head; go up, thou bald head.²⁴ And he turned back, and looked on them, and cursed them in the name of the LORD. And there came forth two she bears out of the wood, and tare forty and two children of them.

Most High does not discriminate against children, if we want our children to have a long healthy life, you need to instill in them what is right. You don't want this to happen. If your child does not listen to your warning; If they are struggling with these spirits. Bring them to these scriptures and put fear in them.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon:

Hygiene is vital and it is up to us mothers to teach them. It is important. We can't have them looking unclean and unkempt. It is no compromise, it has to be done.

Judith 4:11: Thus every man and women, and the little children, and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, fell before the temple, and cast ashes upon their heads, and spread out their sackcloth before the face of the Lord: also they put sackcloth about the altar,

We have to teach our children to pray. You can start training them at 18 months, 12 months. When we are modeling this behavior it will flow. Even though we will face some challenges, if they are seeing this in their everyday life, it is not as hard to iron out, Lord's will.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

No matter what the age, you teach them. Is it easy; no? Yet, I am the mother, it has to be taught. Train up a child; if I don't tell them who will teach them? Their wives will be calling me. You have to teach your sons and daughters, it is the mothers job to teach that.

2 Maccabees 7:27: But she bowing herself toward him, laughing the cruel tyrant to scorn, spake in her country language on this manner; O my son, have pity upon me that bare thee nine months in my womb, and gave thee such three years, and nourished thee, and brought thee up unto this age, and endured the troubles of education.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon:

Endure the troubles of education. This is not easy. This is no joke. This is pull your hair out, brain fried.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

It is your job to make sure they understand everything in class today. It is not a game. Some days I will homeschool one child from 12-6 in just math. I felt like my brain was fried. As soon as I come back, my son asks if I need help in math. Some days it is easy and some days I am stuck and I have to pull them through. I make sure my children are educated. Never think we want you to think it is easy. No; it is hard. We fight for them and when they can't fight for themselves, we continue to fight. Enduring the troubles of education is not a game.

When you are a mom, you are the teacher, chef, doctor, tutor. That was for me to figure out how do I reach her with love. Everyday my brain is fried. Having other offices and maintaining the house. We can't drop the ball. The Most High says I will not give you more than you can bear; we got this! At the end of the day, when they are successful, we can say we did a great job, we did not give up on them; because we pushed through. When there was no confidence mom put the confidence in them. It is your job, you can't do this by being on social media, being an ostrich all day on the phone. You have to commit to teaching these kids God's word, school work and being moral.

As a teacher I have learned so much more than just being a teacher. Nothing replaces that value, that bonding time. We send our children out; this is the exposure. Why wouldn't I homeschool, if I want them to be better? Just like the man says as he

watches his wife, you can't put a price on that. No one will love or want the best for your child more than the mother.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

Even if you don't feel like you are not the best teacher. I have tutors on speed dial. I did math with my son, we were stuck on that one problem. When we got the answer we started screaming we were high fiving and my lord was looking like; what was going on. The pain we went through on 6 sheets of paper.

Sis Anaiyah HOC Gideon:

It is no joke. Homeschooling a kindergartener, I did not know it was this intense. You really have to change your mindset. We are their teacher, we are their everything. If we have that mindset, this will help in being an Israelite mother; having dedication.

A Lot of times we're lazy and don't want to do it. We feel like it is hard. It is hard. It is no joke. That's why our foremothers endured the troubles of education. We have to be that example at all times. There is so much to do with ourselves and our children. Moving forward this is the mindset you have to have.

1 Corinthians 13:11: When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things.

Mother Naamah HOD Asaph:

Your understanding can be child-like. You want to hang out with your friends, cause you understood as a child. When you become a woman who understands this truth. Now it's time to work.
