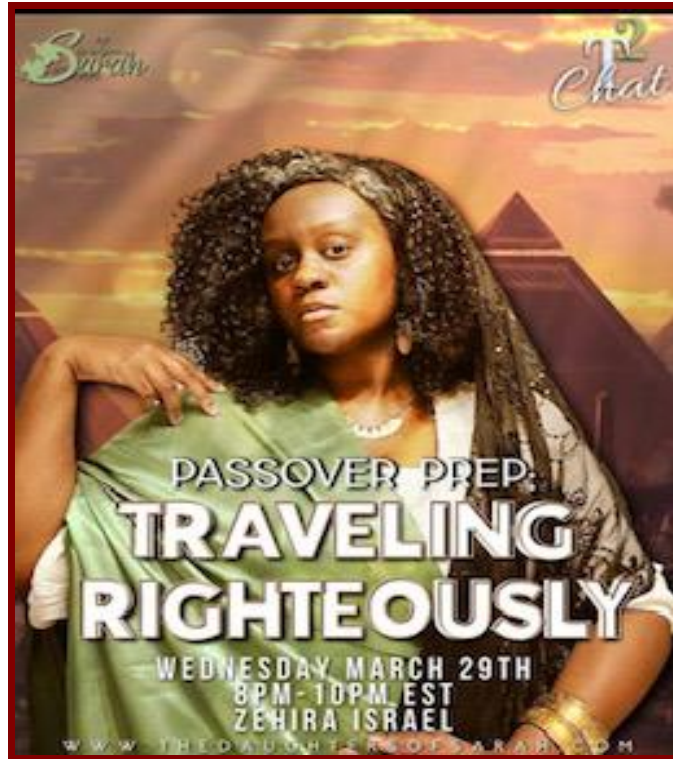




Titus 2 Chat-Passover Prep -Traveling Righteously

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Sometimes there is drama with single sisters and married sisters when it comes to traveling. This class will give valuable tips and guidance to a smooth upcoming travel for Passover.

Prepping – This means to get the leaven out, physically, mentally, and of course Spiritually. We always think of our homes when it comes to removing the leaven and that is certainly the case, however, please also remember these things as well.

1. When shopping minimizes what you're buying with leaven so there is no need to scramble to remove it from the house.
2. Remember to clean:
 - A. Car
 - B. Purses
 - C. Couches
 - D. Baby seats and Baby Strollers
 - E. Under Seat cushions, etc.



The following points will help aid you when traveling and especially with others.

1. Leave bad attitude at home

Mother Shamarah did a previous T2 class touching on this. It was called “Just Be Nice.” The bible tells us to show thyself friendly and do not hold grudges. There are several things that can be attributed to being in a foul mood or grumpy mood, however we are not supposed to hold grudges. Your plans did not go as planned, you’re overpacked; which can lead to stress and anxiety because your lord, or whomever you are riding with is ready to go and you are holding them up because of excessive baggage. You may have a confrontation with someone, be defensive in speech and/or actions. Either way, leave the bad attitude at home.

Proverbs 21:9

⁹ It is better to dwell in a corner of the housetop, than with a brawling woman in a wide house.

Be mindful of this scripture. Traveling with someone with a bad attitude leads people to feel this way about you. No one wants to travel with someone who has a bad attitude.

Proverbs 21:19

¹⁹ It is better to dwell in the wilderness, than with a contentious and an angry woman.

This scripture is good for married sisters, however, can be for us all. It talks about hateful, angry women, contentious women. Our lords do not want to deal with this type of spirit.

Proverbs 30:21-22

3 Things Disquieted – earth upset

Odious married, unpleasant

Hateful

Repulsive

Don’t be this type of person, this type of wife. Be considerate of your lord and how your actions can hinder when traveling.

Proverbs 22:1

A good name in Israel is very important. When we think of favor, we want to be a favorite person others want to travel with. Sis Yemina did a class “Why your lord does not want to travel with you” This is a wonderful class to watch.

Proverbs 18:24

If you want to have friends, you have to show yourself friendly. Check your spirit daily. Bad spirits jump from person to person.

It is time for the purge, dodge the unwanted spirits.



2. Be helpful and considerate of other

Proverbs 31:20

Be willing to help committees and the core team, clean up team, registration team, etc. If and when we can help, we should. Check announcements and see if anyone needs help with anything, volunteer.

Proverbs 31:27

²⁷ She looketh well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness

Do not be idle! We should all find something we are good at and do it and do it wholeheartedly unto TMH.

Sirach 33:27

“Send him to labour, that he be not idle; for idleness teacheth much evil.”

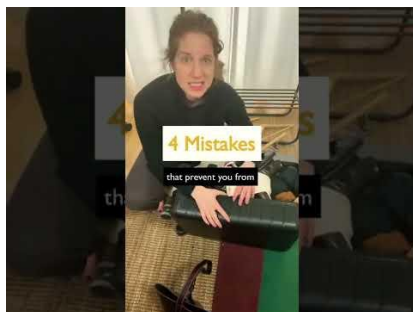
Being idle teaches much evil and this will get us into trouble. Check with the school, in the chat, etc. to see if you can help. We can grocery shop for someone, help clean, put on fringes, help with children etc.

Single sisters can volunteer and need to speak up concerning finances if you need the funds to pick up something for someone. Often times people need financial help but do not say so.

Keep in mind when you are at these hotels, to leave it cleaner than you found it. Clean more than you would at home. Always practice and be mindful of keeping the rooms clean. For couples, be even more considerate.

Example: of not being considerate is overpacking. Our lords have to pack the car and if you overpack then it is time consuming and more work for him. This would go for repacking and coming home as well. It is rude to over pack, be mindful.

The 4 Mistakes Preventing You From Packing Lightly





If you pack at the last minute, this can be attributed to your overpacking. Last minute means packing the day of your trip, or the night before. These will prevent light packing and will for certain cause an issue. If at all possible, give yourself time, pack early! **Be realistic** with what you are packing. Example: Extra shoes, extra garments, extra headwraps, etc.

3. Don't be a beggar/bum

If you are traveling with someone, be upfront about financials if you are having an issue. Do not be cheap and do your part.

Sirach 18:33

"Be not made a begger by banquetting vpon borrowing, when thou hast nothing in thy purse, for thou shalt lie in wait for thy own life: and be talked on.

Proverbs 22:7

"The rich ruleth over the poor, and the borrower *is* servant to the lender."

Pay people back, be clear at the start, seek counsel.

We should not make it a habit to borrow. If you are in need, that is one thing, however, do not make it a habit.

4. Don't be a whore

Deuteronomy 23:17

"There shall be no whore of the daughters of Israel, nor a sodomite of the sons of Israel."

There shall be no whores in Israel; no adultery, no fornication! Travel often times makes it easier to sin. However, just because we are traveling does not mean the laws of TMH are to be forgotten and omitted to give way to the temptations of the flesh. Stay in the spirit and keep the commandments at all times.



Titus 2:5

⁵ To be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God be not blasphemed.

Daughters of Zion are supposed to be pure, virgins (no sex). We are to abstain from ALL sexual intercourse. This includes touching, kissing, etc.

Exodus 22:16

"And if a man entice a maid that is not betrothed, and lie with her, he shall surely endow her to be his wife."

If a single sister lays with a man, you have to get married. This is the law.

Watch Courtship and Marriages videos to help if you are struggling with this. Take this seriously, do not be idle.

If you are unsure about what is sin, get counsel, speak to leadership.

The bible says abstain from the appearance of all evil. If there is no chaperone or someone else around do not put yourself in a position to commit any of these acts.

Isaiah 3:16

"Moreover the LORD saith, Because the daughters of Zion are haughty, and walk with stretched forth necks and wanton eyes, walking and mincing as they go, and making a tinkling with their feet:"

Be mindful of lustful looks. No staring in any brother's face. Stay in the Spirit.

Exodus 20:14

"Thou shalt not commit adultery."

Always be mindful of this scripture and especially when traveling.

Matthew 5:32

³² But I say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery.

The Lord will put sisters away for fornication. Even touching is sin. If a married sister commits adultery she cannot remarry. Count the cost and know the consequences of your actions.



5. Be safe

Sisters can do a buddy-buddy system. It is safe. We get comfortable with security being around us and have to realize that they will not always be around outside of the body.

- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Have your keys in hand on the way to your car
- Do not text while walking
- Check your car quickly before you get in
- Do not hang around, once in your car drive to your destination.

Ecclesiastes 4:9

⁹Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour.

If you can have mace, taser, please do so. See if you can go with someone when you're going out. Remember to keep in contact with others while traveling.

1 Peter 5:8

⁹Use hospitality one to another without grudging.

Be watchful, watch for dangers.

REMINDER: Getting drunk is a sin!

Do not put yourself in bad situations.

6. Be discreet

Definition of discreet –

careful and circumspect in one's speech or actions, especially in order to avoid causing [offense](#) or to gain an advantage.

Be circumspect in one speech.

Example: It is not our place to go and tell others business. If a person wants others to know, they will tell them themselves.

Proverbs 11:13

¹³A talebearer revealeth secrets: but he that is of a faithful spirit concealeth the matter.

A faithful person will keep quiet about others' business.

7. Let your light shine

There will always be people asking questions. Make sure that our light shines in our speech, apparel and actions.



Matthew 5:14-16

¹⁴ Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid.

¹⁵ Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

¹⁶ Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

We should not go outside looking crazy! Remember who we are representing! Make sure the actions reflect in the way we dress and carry ourselves.

Make sure that we abstain from the appearance of all evil! We should protect our spirits at all times dealing with other nations.

1 Peter 2:9

⁹ But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light;

Stay in the Spirit. Remember someone is always watching. Purge out the leaven from our homes and our spirits! Thank you, Shalom.
