

Quiz: Are you obedient like Sarah?

1 Peter 3:6(KJV) Even as Sara obeyed Abraham, calling him lord: whose daughters ye are, as long as ye do well, and are not afraid with any amazement.

Our foremother Sarah was the epitome of obedience. How obedient are you?

For each question, choose the answer that best describes how you would react in the given situation.

- 1. Your lord asks you to support a major life change, such as moving to a new city for his job. How do you respond?
 - a) Agree immediately and start making plans
 - b) Agree, but express your concerns
 - c) Reluctantly agree after much persuasion
 - d) Refuse and choose to stay in your comfortable, familiar surroundings
- 2. You have been working hard all week; early mornings and late hours. You just got home, your feet hurt, and you are ready to retire for the evening. Your lord asks you to prepare food for six brothers. What do you do?
 - a) Get to it without hesitation, you enjoy cooking for others
 - b) Drag your feet and go unwillingly

17. Your lord wants to handle all the finances. What is your reaction?

Scoring System

For each question, assign the following points:

- a) 4 points
- b) 3 points
- c) 2 points
- d) 1 point

Total possible points: 68

Obedience Level:

60-68 points: Exceptionally Obedient

51-59 points: Very Obedient

42-50 points: Obedient

33-41 points: Moderately Obedient 24-32 points: Somewhat Obedient

15-23 points: Needs Improvement in Obedience

0-14 points: Tends Towards Disobedience
