Society teaches us today that we can marry every nation BUT The Most High feels totally different so we need to make sure that we, while we are in this land, are doing what The Most High says.

Hebrews 13:4 (KJV): Marriage *is* honourable in all, and the bed undefiled: but whoremongers and adulterers God will judge.

- Marriage is honorable above all
- An Israelite being married to a white woman, or an East Indian woman is not honorable
- We must teach our sons that they cannot marry anyone who is not of the Twelve Tribes
- A person who is sleeping around outside of their marriage will be judged by God and that judgment could be diseases or sicknesses

Deuteronomy 7:3-6 (KJV)

3 Neither shalt thou make marriages with them; thy daughter thou shalt not give unto his son, nor his daughter shalt thou take unto thy son.

4 For they will turn away thy son from following me, that they may serve other gods: so will the anger of the LORD be kindled against you, and destroy thee suddenly.

5 But thus shall ye deal with them; ye shall destroy their altars, and break down their images, and cut down their groves, and burn their graven images with fire.

6 For thou *art* an holy people unto the LORD thy God: the LORD thy God hath chosen thee to be a special people unto himself, above all people that *are* upon the face of the earth.

7 The LORD did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye *were* the fewest of all people:

- No Interracial Marriages
- TMH said that we should not give our daughters to their sons or their sons to our daughters because they will, not might, turn them away from following God and begin to worship their gods
- It's never too early to train them up right about not marrying someone from the other nations
- Above all means above all – we are not on the same level as everyone else. We are the top rung of the ladder and everyone else are the steps beneath us
- Make sure you are reading along, even the children should be reading – this is to show that what is being brought out are the words of the bible and not the presenter's own

Tobit 4: 12-13 (Apocrypha):

12 Beware of all whoredom, my son, and chiefly take a wife of the seed of thy fathers, and take not a strange woman to wife, which is not of thy father's tribe: for we are the children of the prophets, Noe, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob: remember, my son, that our fathers from the beginning, even that they all married wives of their own kindred, and were blessed in their children, and their seed shall inherit the land.



13 Now therefore, my son, love thy brethren, and despise not in thy heart thy brethren, the sons and daughters of thy people, in not taking a wife of them: for in pride is destruction and much trouble, and in lewdness is decay and great want: for lewdness is the mother of famine.

- Beware of all whoredom (not only with other nations, but with the same sex too)
- Chiefly (mainly) take a wife of your own nation. There is no reason to seek a wife outside of your nation
- Even from the beginning, our forefathers only married Israelite women so that when they had children, they got the blessing
- Prophecy: Israelite men and women who keep the commandments will rule the planet next
- When you don't take a wife/husband of your people, it's because you hate them

Isaiah 55:8-9 (KJV):

8 For my thoughts *are* not your thoughts, neither *are* your ways my ways, saith the LORD.

9 For *as* the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.

- They God thinks is not the way we think and vice versa but it doesn't matter what we think. We need to get on board with how God thinks
- Just like heaven is higher than earth, His ways are higher than our ways – like keeping Israel together and not intermingling with the other nations

Ezra 10:1-5 (KJV):

1 Now when Ezra had prayed, and when he had confessed, weeping and casting himself down before the house of God, there assembled unto him out of Israel a very great congregation of men and women and children: for the people wept very sore.

2 And Shechaniah the son of Jehiel, one of the sons of Elam, answered and said unto Ezra, We have trespassed against our God, and have taken strange wives of the people of the land: yet now there is hope in Israel concerning this thing.

3 Now therefore let us make a covenant with our God to put away all the wives, and such as are born of them, according to the counsel of my lord, and of those that tremble at the commandment of our God; and let it be done according to the law.

4 Arise; for this matter belongeth unto thee: we also will be with thee: be of good courage, and do it.

5 Then arose Ezra, and made the chief priests, the Levites, and all Israel, to swear that they should do according to this word. And they sware.

- They people sinned by marrying people of the other nations – a big deal to God
- Repentance – they wanted to make a covenant with God to put away all non-Israelite women and the children they had with them
- Everybody was to put them away, even the Levites and Priests



1 Esdras 9:7-10 (Apocrypha):

7 So Esdras arose up, and said unto them, Ye have transgressed the law in marrying strange wives, thereby to increase the sins of Israel.

8 And now by confessing give glory unto the Lord God of our fathers,

9 And do his will, and separate yourselves from the heathen of the land, and from the strange women.

10 Then cried the whole multitude, and said with a loud voice, Like as thou hast spoken, so will we do.

- Our people are focusing on the here and now and don't want to keep these laws if it means giving up their spouse of another nation
- Even if we didn't know then about not being in an interracial marriage, we know now, and it should matter
- Give glory to God by acknowledging you married someone of another nation and putting them away
- Just stop and separate spiritually in your mind from the other nations

King Solomon: As he got older, he started to deal with many women from many different nations



1 Kings 11:1-8 (KJV):

1 But king Solomon loved many strange women, together with the daughter of Pharaoh, women of the Moabites, Ammonites, Edomites, Zidonians, *and* Hittites;

2 Of the nations *concerning* which the LORD said unto the children of Israel, Ye shall not go in to them, neither shall they come in unto you: *for* surely they will turn away your heart after their gods: Solomon clave unto these in love.

3 And he had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines: and his wives turned away his heart.

4 For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, *that* his wives turned away his heart after other gods: and his heart was not perfect with the LORD his God, as *was* the heart of David his father.

5 For Solomon went after Ashtoreth the goddess of the Zidonians, and after Milcom the abomination of the Ammonites.

6 And Solomon did evil in the sight of the LORD, and went not fully after the LORD, as *did* David his father.

7 Then did Solomon build an high place for Chemosh, the abomination of Moab, in the hill that *is* before Jerusalem, and for Molech, the abomination of the children of Ammon.

8 And likewise did he for all his strange wives, which burnt incense and sacrificed unto their gods.

Solomon's many strange wives (700) and concubines (300):

- Pharaoh – African women



- Moabites – Chinese women



- Ammonites – Japanese women



- Edomites – White women



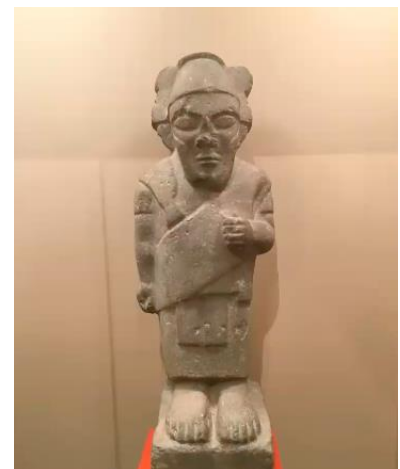
- Zidonians & Hittites – African women



- And King Solomon knew the commandments, but his lusts got the best of him like they sometimes get the best of us
- We must work with them, fine; must go to school with them, fine; but we don't have to marry them
- They turned his heart (mind: Mark 7:21) away from the God of Israel and followed after their gods and he wasn't keeping the commandments
- He began to worship:
 - Ashtoreth (Easter) – Queen of Heaven – Canaanite goddess of war and sexual love



- Milcom – Ammonite chief state god – worship of the stars too



- Chemosh – Moab supreme god – by Israel abomination of Moab



- Molech – Canaanite god – sacrifice of children (abortion today – Planned Parenthood)



- Our people kept worshipping these gods for 400 years after Solomon's death until King Josiah
- We need to make sure we are doing exactly what God says
- It is not a light thing if your child wants to marry someone of another nation

Numbers 25:1-9 (KJV):

1 And Israel abode in Shittim, and the people began to commit whoredom with the daughters of Moab.

2 And they called the people unto the sacrifices of their gods: and the people did eat and bowed down to their gods.

3 And Israel joined himself unto Baalpeor: and the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel.

4 And the LORD said unto Moses, Take all the heads of the people, and hang them up before the LORD against the sun, that the fierce anger of the LORD may be turned away from Israel.

5 And Moses said unto the judges of Israel, Slay ye every one his men that were joined unto Baalpeor.

6 And, behold, one of the children of Israel came and brought unto his brethren a Midianitish woman in the sight of Moses, and in the sight of all the congregation of the children of Israel, who were weeping before the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.



7 And when Phinehas, the son of Eleazar, the son of Aaron the priest, saw it, he rose up from among the congregation, and took a javelin in his hand;
8 And he went after the man of Israel into the tent, and thrust both of them through, the man of Israel, and the woman through her belly. So the plague was stayed from the children of Israel.
9 And those that died in the plague were twenty and four thousand.

- Israel started to mix with the Moabite women and committed whoredom
- Israel bowed down their gods
- Again, Israel joined to:
 - Baal-peor – Canaanite god of fertility, rain, and storms



- The Most High wanted to make an example of those that disobeyed the law killing them and hanging their heads up against the sun before the Lord
- Moses said to kill everyone that was worshipping Baal-peor
- One Israelite man dishonored the tabernacle with a Moabite woman in front of everyone and both were killed by Phinehas
- He brought the sin back in as Moses and the elders were trying to keep the sin out, so he was killed and the plague (24,000 died because of their worship of Baal-peor) was stayed from Israel

Samson and the Philistine woman:





Numbers 6:1-7 (KJV):

1 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
2 Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When either man or woman shall separate *themselves* to vow a vow of a Nazarite, to separate *themselves* unto the LORD:
3 He shall separate *himself* from wine and strong drink, and shall drink no vinegar of wine, or vinegar of strong drink, neither shall he drink any liquor of grapes, nor eat moist grapes, or dried.
4 All the days of his separation shall he eat nothing that is made of the vine tree, from the kernels even to the husk.
5 All the days of the vow of his separation there shall no razor come upon his head: until the days be fulfilled, in the which he separateth *himself* unto the LORD, he shall be holy, *and* shall let the locks of the hair of his head grow.
6 All the days that he separateth *himself* unto the LORD he shall come at no dead body.
7 He shall not make himself unclean for his father, or for his mother, for his brother, or for his sister, when they die: because the consecration of his God *is* upon his head

Vow of the Nazarite:

- Separate for the Lord's Purpose
- Not allowed to drink wine or strong drink or anything made from grapes
- Eat nothing made from the vine tree, from kernels to husk
- No razor shall touch his head and let his hair grow
- Shall not touch any dead body

Judges 13:1-21, 24 (KJV):

1 And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of the LORD; and the LORD delivered them into the hand of the Philistines forty years.
2 And there was a certain man of Zorah, of the family of the Danites, whose name *was* Manoah; and his wife *was* barren, and bare not.
3 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto the woman, and said unto her, Behold now, thou *art* barren, and bearest not: but thou shalt conceive, and bear a son.
4 Now therefore beware, I pray thee, and drink not wine nor strong drink, and eat not any unclean *thing*:
5 For, lo, thou shalt conceive, and bear a son; and no razor shall come on his head: for the child shall be a Nazarite unto God from the womb: and he shall begin to deliver Israel out of the hand of the Philistines.
6 Then the woman came and told her husband, saying, A man of God came unto me, and his countenance *was* like the countenance of an angel of God, very terrible: but I asked him not whence he *was*, neither told he me his name:
7 But he said unto me, Behold, thou shalt conceive, and bear a son; and now drink no wine nor strong drink, neither eat any unclean *thing*: for the child shall be a Nazarite to God from the womb to the day of his death.
8 Then Manoah intreated the LORD, and said, O my Lord, let the man of God which thou didst send come again unto us, and teach us what we shall do unto the child that shall be born.
9 And God hearkened to the voice of Manoah; and the angel of God came again unto the woman as she sat in the field: but Manoah her husband *was* not with her.



10 And the woman made haste, and ran, and shewed her husband, and said unto him, Behold, the man hath appeared unto me, that came unto me the *other* day.

11 And Manoah arose, and went after his wife, and came to the man, and said unto him, *Art* thou the man that spakest unto the woman? And he said, I *am*.

12 And Manoah said, Now let thy words come to pass. How shall we order the child, and *how* shall we do unto him?

13 And the angel of the LORD said unto Manoah, Of all that I said unto the woman let her beware.

14 She may not eat of any *thing* that cometh of the vine, neither let her drink wine or strong drink, nor eat any unclean *thing*: all that I commanded her let her observe.

15 And Manoah said unto the angel of the LORD, I pray thee, let us detain thee, until we shall have made ready a kid for thee.

16 And the angel of the LORD said unto Manoah, Though thou detain me, I will not eat of thy bread: and if thou wilt offer a burnt offering, thou must offer it unto the LORD. For Manoah knew not that he *was* an angel of the LORD.

17 And Manoah said unto the angel of the LORD, What *is* thy name, that when thy sayings come to pass we may do thee honour?

18 And the angel of the LORD said unto him, Why askest thou thus after my name, seeing it *is* secret?

19 So Manoah took a kid with a meat offering, and offered *it* upon a rock unto the LORD: and *the angel* did wondrously; and Manoah and his wife looked on.

20 For it came to pass, when the flame went up toward heaven from off the altar, that the angel of the LORD ascended in the flame of the altar. And Manoah and his wife looked on *it*, and fell on their faces to the ground.

21 But the angel of the LORD did no more appear to Manoah and to his wife. Then Manoah knew that he *was* an angel of the LORD.

- Israelites were in slavery for 40 years under the Philistines (Africans).
- Manoah's wife was barren
- Angel visited the wife and told her she was going to have a son
- She was instructed not to drink or eat any unclean foods and not shave his hair
- Samson's purpose was to be a Nazarite for life
- Samson was born and was blessed by God

Judges 14:1- 20 (KJV):

1 And Samson went down to Timnath, and saw a woman in Timnath of the daughters of the Philistines.

2 And he came up, and told his father and his mother, and said, I have seen a woman in Timnath of the daughters of the Philistines: now therefore get her for me to wife.

3 Then his father and his mother said unto him, *Is there* never a woman among the daughters of thy brethren, or among all my people, that thou goest to take a wife of the uncircumcised Philistines? And Samson said unto his father, Get her for me; for she pleaseth me well.

4 But his father and his mother knew not that it *was* of the LORD, that he sought an occasion against the Philistines: for at that time the Philistines had dominion over Israel.



5 Then went Samson down, and his father and his mother, to Timnath, and came to the vineyards of Timnath: and, behold, a young lion roared against him.

6 And the Spirit of the LORD came mightily upon him, and he rent him as he would have rent a kid, and *he had* nothing in his hand: but he told not his father or his mother what he had done.

7 And he went down, and talked with the woman; and she pleased Samson well.

8 And after a time he returned to take her, and he turned aside to see the carcase of the lion: and, behold, *there was* a swarm of bees and honey in the carcase of the lion.

9 And he took thereof in his hands, and went on eating, and came to his father and mother, and he gave them, and they did eat: but he told not them that he had taken the honey out of the carcase of the lion.

10 So his father went down unto the woman: and Samson made there a feast; for so used the young men to do.

11 And it came to pass, when they saw him, that they brought thirty companions to be with him.

12 And Samson said unto them, I will now put forth a riddle unto you: if ye can certainly declare it me within the seven days of the feast, and find *it* out, then I will give you thirty sheets and thirty change of garments:

13 But if ye cannot declare *it* me, then shall ye give me thirty sheets and thirty change of garments. And they said unto him, Put forth thy riddle, that we may hear it.

14 And he said unto them, Out of the eater came forth meat, and out of the strong came forth sweetness. And they could not in three days expound the riddle.

15 And it came to pass on the seventh day, that they said unto Samson's wife, Entice thy husband, that he may declare unto us the riddle, lest we burn thee and thy father's house with fire: have ye called us to take that we have? *is it* not so?

16 And Samson's wife wept before him, and said, Thou dost but hate me, and lovest me not: thou hast put forth a riddle unto the children of my people, and hast not told *it* me. And he said unto her, Behold, I have not told *it* my father nor my mother, and shall I tell *it* thee?

17 And she wept before him the seven days, while their feast lasted: and it came to pass on the seventh day, that he told her, because she lay sore upon him: and she told the riddle to the children of her people.

18 And the men of the city said unto him on the seventh day before the sun went down, What *is* sweeter than honey? and what *is* stronger than a lion? And he said unto them, If ye had not plowed with my heifer, ye had not found out my riddle.

19 And the Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he went down to Ashkelon, and slew thirty men of them, and took their spoil, and gave change of garments unto them which expounded the riddle. And his anger was kindled, and he went up to his father's house.

20 But Samson's wife was *given* to his companion, whom he had used as his friend.

- Samson wanted to marry a Philistine woman and went to his parents to ask of it
- His parents asked why he couldn't find a woman of the twelve tribes. They knew the law not to marry outside the nation
- Samson's marriage to the Philistine woman was a move of God and he was using Samson to bring vengeance on the Philistines
- Samson met and killed a young lion with his hands by the spirit of the Lord



- The Most High gave Samson super strength because of the obedience of his mother to follow the Lord's instructions during his raising
- Samson touched the dead body (against the rule of Nazarite) of the lion to get honey out of it and gave his parents some without telling them he got it from a dead animal
- Samson was doing his own thing disobeying God – he had many sins
- Samson married the Philistine woman anyway
- He gave a riddle to her people and when they couldn't solve it, they requested that she go to her husband to get the answer
- She was not loyal to Samson because she wasn't an Israelite – she was only loyal to her people and that's why we don't marry the other nations
- She tried guilting him into giving her the answer and he did. She then told her people the answer – disloyalty
- Samson slew thirty men in Ashkelon under the spirit of the Lord to get the thirty garments to give to his wife's people to fulfill the agreement of the riddle
- Samson left to go fight for his wife's people and while gone her father gave her to another Philistine to marry. There is no loyalty to us from the other nations

Judges 15:1- 20 (KJV):

1 But it came to pass within a while after, in the time of wheat harvest, that Samson visited his wife with a kid; and he said, I will go in to my wife into the chamber. But her father would not suffer him to go in.

2 And her father said, I verily thought that thou hadst utterly hated her; therefore I gave her to thy companion: *is not her younger sister fairer than she?* take her, I pray thee, instead of her.

3 And Samson said concerning them, Now shall I be more blameless than the Philistines, though I do them a displeasure.

4 And Samson went and caught three hundred foxes, and took firebrands, and turned tail to tail, and put a firebrand in the midst between two tails.

5 And when he had set the brands on fire, he let *them* go into the standing corn of the Philistines, and burnt up both the shocks, and also the standing corn, with the vineyards *and* olives.

6 Then the Philistines said, Who hath done this? And they answered, Samson, the son in law of the Timnite, because he had taken his wife, and given her to his companion. And the Philistines came up, and burnt her and her father with fire.

7 And Samson said unto them, Though ye have done this, yet will I be avenged of you, and after that I will cease.

8 And he smote them hip and thigh with a great slaughter: and he went down and dwelt in the top of the rock Etam.

9 Then the Philistines went up, and pitched in Judah, and spread themselves in Lehi.

10 And the men of Judah said, Why are ye come up against us? And they answered, To bind Samson are we come up, to do to him as he hath done to us.

11 Then three thousand men of Judah went to the top of the rock Etam, and said to Samson, Knowest thou not that the Philistines *are* rulers over us? what *is* this *that* thou hast done unto us? And he said unto them, As they did unto me, so have I done unto them.

12 And they said unto him, We are come down to bind thee, that we may deliver thee into the hand of the Philistines. And Samson said unto them, Swear unto me, that ye will not fall upon me yourselves.



13 And they spake unto him, saying, No; but we will bind thee fast, and deliver thee into their hand: but surely we will not kill thee. And they bound him with two new cords, and brought him up from the rock.

14 And when he came unto Lehi, the Philistines shouted against him: and the Spirit of the LORD came mightily upon him, and the cords that *were* upon his arms became as flax that was burnt with fire, and his bands loosed from off his hands.

15 And he found a new jawbone of an ass, and put forth his hand, and took it, and slew a thousand men therewith.

16 And Samson said, With the jawbone of an ass, heaps upon heaps, with the jaw of an ass have I slain a thousand men.

17 And it came to pass, when he had made an end of speaking, that he cast away the jawbone out of his hand, and called that place Ramathlehi.

18 And he was sore athirst, and called on the LORD, and said, Thou hast given this great deliverance into the hand of thy servant: and now shall I die for thirst, and fall into the hand of the uncircumcised?

19 But God clave an hollow place that *was* in the jaw, and there came water thereout; and when he had drunk, his spirit came again, and he revived: wherefore he called the name thereof Enhakkore, which *is* in Lehi unto this day.

20 And he judged Israel in the days of the Philistines twenty years.

- Samson went to visit his wife during the wheat harvest and found out that his wife was given to another to marry
- Samson was so angry he took 300 foxes, tied firebrands to their tails, and let them loose in the Philistine fields to burn up all the harvest

- When the Philistines found out what Samson had, they burned his wife and her father with fire, and he took revenge and killed them
- The Philistines came up against Judah for Samson so 3,000 Israelite men went to Samson to bind him to deliver him to the Philistines
- Once he was delivered, the spirit of the Lord came upon him and his binds were broken, he took a jawbone of an ass and slew 1,000 men

- All those men died because he went against God and married a woman outside of the nation of Israel

This is why The Most High told us to marry your own people because there is no loyalty in the other nations to us

We must train our sons to marry an Israelite woman



The Moral of the Story Is: Don't marry outside of the Twelve Tribes of Israel!!!
