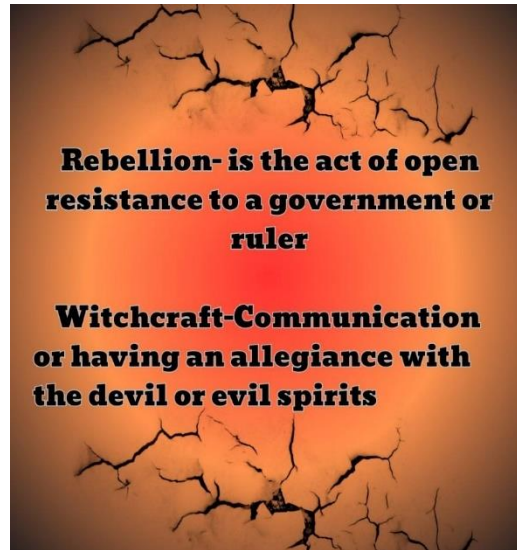
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Topic Title and Reason

I chose this title to understand better why God compares rebellion to witchcraft.

1 Samuel 15:23- For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry: because thou hast rejected the word of the Lord, he hath also rejected thee from being king.



We understand the divine order to be God, Men, Women, and Children. Any deviation from this order can be seen as an act of rebellion. To make it simple, the scriptures are saying when we're rebellious, we are working for Satan. There are things, even as repenting women, we are still doing that show we have an allegiance with Satan.

Video Discussion 1: What Happened to Women?

In this video, men discuss the Willie Lynch letter and how we have fallen as a people. Pay attention to the woman in the white dress. *What were your thoughts on the woman and her spirit?*

She was triggered, and although she had little to say, you could clearly see it in her body language. We know that the brother was telling the truth, but did you notice how the brother stopped what he was talking about to confront that spirit within the sister? He said she was uncomfortable because she wasn't used to being around a masculine man.

She had become a watchdog for Esau, so her processing and mindset come from another spirit. It's obvious she does not respect the black man at all by dismissing what he says and diminishing his role to a producer or, in other words, a sperm donor. She is the prime example of Esau doing their job right. This is why I chose this topic: just like we see the spirits in her, we must also recognize those spirits within ourselves and examine who we are giving our allegiance.

Romans 6:16

We all have an allegiance to somebody; it's either going to be God or Satan. The brother said another thing: a woman with that mindset is dangerous. So today, we're going to go over five rebellious spirits that are dangerous not just to yourself but to your husband, your children, and your nation.

5 Rebellious Spirits



Romans 15:4 For whatsoever things were written aforetime, were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.

There is a quote that goes; *Those who do not learn from the past are doomed to repeat it.*



Overcoming When Satan Enters In

Bishop said something here; he said very few women understand that we're playing a scene all over again. So sister don't be deceived, we like to talk about Eve but remember you are Eve.

We all have the opportunity to play that same role and choose another path. Eve was rebellious, she opened up her spirit and gave her allegiance to another man, and he used her to do his bidding, leaving her to suffer the consequences. That's no different from today.

Esau, through Willie Lynch, is using us to destroy our nation, and it's going to leave us to the consequences, which is death.

So, let's talk about how these spirits gain access to us.

Proverbs 15:4 A wholesome tongue is a tree of life: but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit.

Perverseness: Deliberately deviating from what's good.

So, when we do that, we leave the door cracked open for sin to enter. And the only way sin can enter is if we allow those spirits in. And the only thing that will close those cracks is the laws.

We have to remember that the Bible says unclean spirits are roaming around looking for homes. Some of those spirits have been living within us for a long time. So, let's start giving out eviction notices.

The first dangerous spirit we're going to talk about is,



Sirach 10:13 For pride is the beginning of sin, and he that hath it, shall power out abomination: and therefore the Lord brought upon them strange calamities, and overthrew them utterly.

This is where sin starts: the mother of them all, and through her, other spirits can gain access to us.

V12 The beginning of pride is, when one departeth from God, and his heart is turned away from his maker.

This is the same spirit our foremother Eve dealt with. She knew the rules, but her mind departed from her maker, and she wanted to do her own thing.

Signs this spirit resigns in you:



You believe you're smarter than your husband because of your educational or career status, hearing the truth first, or having a stronger zeal so you feel more devoted than he is. This is a dangerous spirit.

Some things this spirit may do is point out his shortcomings/weaknesses. Make him feel inadequate, talk down to him, challenge him, and even battle him in the scriptures. It even causes you to disrespect his decisions or his opinions.

Questioning His Ideas

I pray none of us are speaking to our husbands this way. This kind of demon will destroy your whole house. It doesn't matter how smart you think you are, God is smarter.

Proverbs 8:4 Unto you, O men, I call, and my voice is to the sons of man.

God says he's calling the men. This does not say women. So your degrees, achievements, job titles, and accolades don't matter when it comes to these men in the truth. God calls 144,000 men to take over this world, so don't be deceived. God does not play about his sons. So, we have to be mindful of how we treat them.

God will kill you, move you out of the way, or make your life miserable with affliction. Some of you wonder why you're sick all the time. You may want to examine if you have one of these spirits. Just because you can't see Christ in him does not mean he is not there. Our forefathers were deemed small in the world when they were called.

1 Corinthians 1:27 But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world, to confound the wise: and God hath chosen the weak things of the world, to confound the things which are mighty:

God has chosen the weak things. Although I came to the truth a year before my husband, I had to realize that it wasn't about me. God used me to get to that man; that's who he wanted, and this is not to say that God does not love us sisters. It's just God calling the men. The men are the ones who are going to do the work and put this kingdom back on top.

So, get over yourself and remember it's not about how you think or feel. Anytime you put yourself over the mission, that's pride, and it's a demon.

The best way to find yourself is when you lose yourself in the service of others.

We are all called to be servants to our husbands; we are their helpmeets. And any of the gifts you've gained in the world is to help and benefit him.

Charity seeketh not her own. So we should not think about ourselves. This can be difficult because I've lived it and I understand how it is.

Ways To Use Wisdom When You Don't Agree With Your Husband

1. Say nothing. The best thing to do is be supportive and let God work it out.

Sirach 20:6 Some man holdeth his tongue, because he hath not to answer, and some keepeth silence, knowing his time.



Examine his spirit to see if he's even in the place to hear your opinions. But first, examine your spirit because if you know your delivery will be off, do what the Bible says and put the tongue to the roof of your mouth, i.e. Psalms 137.

That's what Abigail did as well. She had situational awareness. She knew when it was the right time to speak to her husband. It is not easy to humble down, but we must humble ourselves to the scriptures and follow the examples of our foremothers.

How do you follow a man you don't have confidence in?

Hebrews 11:8 By faith Abraham when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed, and he went out, not knowing whither he went.

The point is that Abraham did not know where he was going, yet we don't read about Sarah questioning him, saying, *what do you mean you don't know where you going?* She followed him because she knew God was dealing with him. If your husband is in this truth, God is dealing with him, and you don't have to have complete confidence in him, especially if you're coming out of the world. We need to learn to have faith and trust God, not leaning on our own understanding.

2. Never appear to know more than your Husband.

Sirach 20:8 He that speaeth many words shall be abhorred; and he that taketh to himself authority therein, shall be hated.

This is a sister who believes she has all the answers and wants to control the situation. This is taking authority. No one, including her husband, wants to work with a sister like this.

We have to take away phrases like I think we need to do it this way, or See, I tried to tell you, or I told you it would happen like that; you should have listened to me. Statements like that are unprofitable to us it breaks down communication and your husband will not want to share anything with you. You will be hated.

Our foremothers did not over-talk the men or take over the conversation. We didn't roll like that; we were women of few words who waited for the right moment to speak. And when we did, it meant something.

3. Keep It Short

Sisters if you can't keep quiet and you're over-talking to the point of talking too much that's a sign that you may have a pride demon on you. You feel like what you have to say is so important that it has to be heard, you have to get your point across, or you have to justify yourself.

Proverbs 10:19 In the multitude of words there wanteth not sin: but he that refraineth his lips, is wise.

We need to be able to get our point across without using a multitude of words. Some sisters talk so much that they dig themselves into a ditch they can't climb out of.

This is why the scripture talks about a silent and loving woman. We were never meant to talk a lot. If this is something you do then this is something you need to work on.

The second dangerous spirit is:



Sirach 19:2 Wine and women will make men of understanding to fall away, and he that cleave unto harlots will become impudent.

This scripture doesn't just refer to a woman who sleeps around, but to someone who worships another God.

1. Manipulation is emasculation;

Its end goal is to use you to weaken your husband so that God cannot use him. One way a sister can manipulate her husband is by changing him. Why would a sister want to do this? Because he may not be growing as fast as you want him to, you may think it's your responsibility to change him. You'll justify these actions by saying you love him or because you're his helpmeet and so you make a list of all his faults and try to adjust them one by one.

You think you're doing this out of love, but actually, it's not. It comes across as nagging or criticism disguised as critique. It will sound something like; *I see you've been on your game all day. Have you read your Bible? When are you going to watch a class or read your bible? Or, Soldier Malachi came in at the same time we did, and he's an officer now. Why didn't you go to M.O.V. you want to stay a brother forever?* No tact whatsoever.

She'll also ask him questions because leadership has said that when your Lord doesn't have the same zeal as you, you should ask him questions. But this sister will, and when he answers, tell him that his answer is wrong and that leadership did not break it down that way. This is a dangerous spirit. It causes problems, destroys communication, and will cause him to shut down. It can affect his self-esteem and show him that you're not satisfied with who he is. So, he'll withdraw from you, build up resentment, and ultimately, if he's not built up, it will drive him further from the truth. The point is, it doesn't work.

We have to be tactical in the way we approach these types of situations. Now, some sisters love their husbands and want to see them excel. And there is a quote: *The road to hell is paved with good intentions.* So, you'll want to do good, but that's not the way God told you to do it.

Remember, I said the Pride demon is the gateway for all other spirits to gain entrance. Because you think you can do it your own way, you turned away from God, and you allowed Manipulation to come in because God told us how to do it.

1 Peter 3:1 Likewise, ye wives, be in subjection to your own husbands, that if any obey not the word, they also may without the word be won by the conversation of the wives:

V2 While they behold your chaste conversation coupled with fear:

So, you have to work on you. Once you start working on yourself, your Husband will see your change. And we have to know to have success in this truth we have to do it God's way not our way.

So, you want to know why some of your husbands are not growing in the truth? You may want to look in the mirror. You may be his stumbling block. Have you considered that God is waiting for you? I can tell you from experience that when I fell back, I saw my husband grow. The scriptures work. All we have to do is apply it.

2. You are dismissive.

Being dismissive is showing that something is unworthy of consideration.

So, what are some ways we are dismissive of our husbands? We use silent treatment, walk away when he's speaking, ignore calls or messages, respond with short responses, and do not greet or acknowledge his presence. I asked everyone's opinions except his, and I didn't want to talk about this anymore. These are all ways that show you are displeased with him and he is not a priority. All of these things say **I don't respect you**.

1 Edras 4:29 Yet did I see him and Apame the Kings concubine, the daughter of the admirable Bartacus, sitting at the right hand of the King,

V30 And taking the crown from the Kings head, and setting it upon her own head; she also stroke the King with her left hand.

V31 And yet for all this, the King gaped and gazed upon her with open mouth: if she laughed upon him, he laughed also: but if she took any displeasure at him, the King was fine to flatter, that she might be reconciled to him again.

Purposely showing that you're upset to get attention or that he'll cater to you is manipulation. This is a demon sister, and God can't use a man that a woman manipulates. So, when you do this you show that you hate your husband.

Another example of this is in Judges 16:15 between Samson and Delilah. She said he didn't love her to change Samson's spirit, and it worked.

Nonverbal Dismissive Behavior

I've been with my husband for the last 25 years, and I've done everything she's done in this video. I want to share a moment with you all when I was caught red-handed.

This is me, and it's not a moment I'm proud of. This was some years ago, and one of my sisters caught me in the background of her picture looking at my husband like this.



I'm not perfect, and as a teaching moment, this shows that what's in your spirit will show up on your face.

Sirach 25:17 The wickedness of a woman changeth her face, and darkeneth her countenance like sackcloth.

This demon showed up on my face. And no, it's not a recent picture. This happened a while ago, and I am still working on myself. But this was disrespectful.

In the Bible, our righteous foremothers did not have countenances like this.

Countenance: Facial Expression, Indication of mood, emotion, or character.

Abigail was said to have a beautiful. Tamar was a woman of fair countenance; Judith was of a goodly countenance and very beautiful to behold. This shows that your countenance and being beautiful are not the same thing. Esther's countenance was cheerful and very amiable. This means friendly.

So you are telling me that my face shows my character? Sisters that have this face is because there is a struggle going on mentally. We like to call it the resting B face but

that's an excuse. This is Sirach 25:17, which is showing your wickedness. Our foremothers did not have that type of face so we have to stop making that excuse. This is something I'm still working on.

Sirach 19:29 A man may be known by his look, and one that hath understanding by his countenance, when thou meetest him.

When you see a sister whose countenance is off, she may have some issues going on, okay?

Sirach 13:25 The heart of a man changeth his countenance, whether it be for good or evil: and a merry heart maketh a cheerful countenance.

V26 A cheerful countenance is a token of a heart that is in prosperity; and the finding out of parables is a wearisome labour of the mind.

When you have wisdom and prosperity it's going to show on your face. This is something we all need to think about when we have those looks. It means something; like I said, it means there is a struggle going on.

Another form of manipulation is withholding sex or using sex to get your way. I won't get too in depth with this but we should know that our bodies are not our owns but our husbands and that's not something we should be using.

All of these are ways of manipulation, whether a sister tries to change her husband, being dismissive, or withholding sex. None of this comes from God. So the next time you decide not to pick up your phone or give your husband a disapproving look, I want you all to think about who you are allegiant to. These are all ways women try to change men's feelings so that they cater to them. I know because I used to do it: silent treatment? That was my thing because I knew he would ask me what was wrong, but as these men grow in the truth it doesn't work anymore. The last time I did it, which was the last time, he told me I had the devil on me.

Revelation 14:4 These are they which were not defiled with women; for they are virgins. These are they which follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth. These were redeemed from among men, *being* the firstfruits unto God and to the Lamb.

The men God is calling will not be defiled with women. So, no for sure if you are doing these things with your husband and it's working both of you are not going to get the kingdom. God can't use him and he can't use you because you're not fulfilling your purpose.

The third dangerous spirit is;



Sirach 25:23 A wicked woman abateth the courage, maketh an heavy countenance and a wounded heart: a woman that will not comfort her husband in distress maketh weak hands and feeble knees.

Bishop Yawasap's Class

Bishop says, a sister will make sure that his mind is not messed up. So, hatred is a spirit that will fail to encourage or comfort her husband while he's in distress.

Distress is an external and usually temporary cause of great mental strain and stress. I want to focus on the stress he may go through in the congregation. When your husband goes through something, you're most likely to be the first person he tells.

Bishop did a class on the signs of disloyalty, and I'm going to give you four:

1. Self-willed- You're told to do something and do the opposite.
2. Offended- You see correction as an attack
3. Passive- You start pulling back and are not as present as you used to be.
4. Criticism- They have an evil eye and find fault in everyone but themselves.

It is our job to pay attention to the changes in our husbands spirit.

Sirach 22:24 As the vapour and smoke of a furnace goeth before the fire; so reviling before blood.

A tower is not just a stronghold or safe place. It's also a defense.

What A Tower Looks Like



When we read the scriptures, they would build a tower back in Jerusalem. The reason is that a tower can see everything. If there's an army, a fire, or smoke, they can see it, and this is what we should be to our husbands. It is a responsibility for a wife to always be watching and listening.

Sirach 36:23 If there be kindness, meekness, and comfort, in her tongue, then is not her husband like other men.

This sister, when she hears certain things won't blast her husband with scriptures. She will use kindness, comfort, and meekness in her tongue. She will have the scriptures in her mouth, not like Sirach 26:22, but like how Abigail moved concerning David. She had the scriptures in her mouth, being able to calm him down. That's why when Nabal died he had to have Abigail on his team because he knew if he fell she had his back.

The scriptures say, then, is her husband like other men, the reason being that most women won't do this. Most women will hear their husbands murmur and be in agreeance. If you're not correcting him, you are in agreeance, and you have an allegiance with Satan.

Let's say your husband is murmuring; you could say You know we're all sick and dealing with something. That's why we have to make sure we keep each other in prayer. God is going to try us to see whether or not we stay in the spirit.

Sirach 1:19 Wisdom raineth down skill and knowledge of understanding standing, and exalteth them to honour that hold her fast.

If we stay diligent in this truth and study, Christ will give us the wisdom to speak life into our husbands.

On Instagram, I saw a white woman say that there is a fool and king in every person, and the one you speak to is the one you will see emerge. So, if you agree with your husband and co-sign on things, you know are not right, you're speaking to the fool in him.

But when the scriptures are on your tongue and there's comfort and meekness there you're speaking to the king in him.

Acts 5:1 But a certain man named Ananias, with Sapphira his wife, sold a possession,

V2 And kept back *part* of the price, his wife also being privy *to it*, and brought a certain part, and laid *it* at the apostles' feet.

God wrote Privy because there will be women who will be Privy to what their husbands say, and do.

James 4:17 Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin.

It's sin and hatred because you're being rebellious to who God called you to be. Se was supposed to help him, so shame on any women who sits back and watch their husband fall. When his light starts to dim that's when your light is supposed to be brighter.

Choose Your Partner Wisely

This is what we're supposed to be to our husbands, and shame on you and me if we're not doing this for him. His success is your success.

As our Bishop said a man can damn near do anything with the support of his woman behind him. This spirit of hatred will have you fail your husband when he really needs you. This spirit does not just want to take him out but everyone around you.

The fourth dangerous spirit is:



1 Corinthians 15:33 Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners.

We have to make sure we are not evil communicating in the home. And that we're not teaching our children an evil lesson. It's a cancer and it spreads.

Signs of neglecting your children:

1. Not providing emotional support or guidance

This mother lacks empathy and communication. She does not provide a safe place for her children to express their emotions and may withhold verbal or physical affection. When was the last time you told your teenagers you love them? Or went into their room and gave them a big hug.

2. Not setting expectations and following through with consequences.



When your child sees you ignore their wrongdoings, your child will grow to disrespect your authority.

3. Not spending quality time with your children.

Even if you're really busy set aside time to spend with them. Even set aside time to communicate with them about their feelings and tough times they are facing as pre-teens/teenagers.

4. Not providing discipline or structure with the scriptures.

This is something we have to instill in them every day. What you put in is what you get out. And if you're not putting in anything everyone can see it. God sees it.

2 Chronicles 21:5 Jehoram *was* thirty and two years old when he began to reign, and he reigned eight years in Jerusalem.

V6 And he walked in the way of the kings of Israel, like as did the house of Ahab: for he had the daughter of Ahab to wife: and he wrought *that which was* evil in the eyes of the LORD.

Athaliah was Jezebel's daughter and Jehoram's wife.

2 Chronicles 22:2 Forty and two years old *was* Ahaziah when he began to reign, and he reigned one year in Jerusalem. His mother's name also *was* Athaliah the daughter of Omri.

When you are a bad influence, we leave generational curses behind like Jezebel and her daughter Athaliah. Break the cycle of unprofitable mothers.

Deuteronomy 6:7 And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walks by the way, and when thou lies down, and when thou rises up.

Raise the kind of children you want on your team. Having children that will check you is a beautiful thing. Have children that are an asset not a liability.

Some of the things Malcom X's wife did for their children: Retaught them things they had learned in school because she wanted to make sure she instilled what she wanted them to learn. She would cut newspaper clippings and have them read them, if they messed up she make them grab a dictionary and sound the word out. She did this all while taking care of the house. When they went to church afterwards she would discuss what they thought about the service.

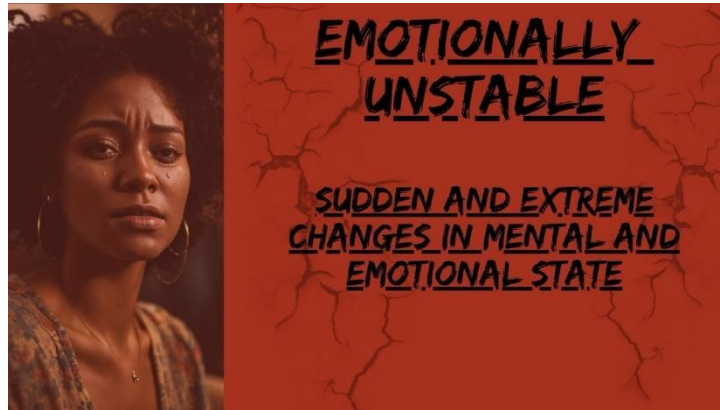
I said this to say how many of you are having these conversations with your children? When you're riding home after sabbath are you asking them what they thought about class? What was their favorite point? Do you even discuss the class with your children. Our children should be excited about the bible.

Acts 16:14 And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard *us*: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

V15 And when she was baptized, and her household, she besought *us*, saying, If ye have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come into my house, and abide *there*. And she constrained us.

How do you think she was moving in her household? She was being a light.

The fifth dangerous spirit is:



This is a rebellious spirit because you lack self-control. Anytime you allow your emotions to lead your taking heed to the demons in you instead of the word or God. Again, this is Pride and so you allow for this demon to slide in.

Divorce Court

We all have ticks, but we also need to be able to control them. These are triggers and basically they show what needs to be fixed in you.

When we get that irritating feeling, or sinking feeling in our guts when we dislike something, or anger stirring up, these are all triggers and it shows you where you're weak. A lot of the times these triggers can cause us to overthink and look at everything in a negative light. That's called pessimism.

Pessimism is a negative mindset that constantly looks for or expects the worst.

Titus 1:15 Unto the pure all things *are* pure: but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving *is* nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled.

When you constantly have negative thoughts the scripture tells you that your mind is defiled. Defiled with what? Another spirit. We know to be associated with Christ is to be positive.

Romans 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to *his* purpose.

Be positive . The root cause of our suffering is the way we think and we can change our outcomes by changing our thoughts.

2 Esdras 9:38 And when I spake these things in my heart, I looked back with mine eyes, and upon the right side I saw a woman, and, behold, she mourned and wept with a loud voice, and was much grieved in heart, and her clothes were rent, and she had ashes upon her head.

V39 Then let I my thoughts go that I was in, and turned me unto her,

V40 And said unto her, Wherefore weapest thou? why art thou so grieved in thy mind?

V41 And she said unto me, Sir, let me alone, that I may bewail myself, and add unto my sorrow, for I am sore vexed in my mind, and brought very low.

V42 And I said unto her, What aileth thee? tell me.

2 Esdras 10:1 And it so came to pass, that when my son was entered into his wedding chamber, he fell down, and died.

V4 And I do now purpose not to return into the city, but here to stay, and neither to eat nor drink, but continually to mourn and to fast until I die.

She's all in her emotions, understandably so due to grievance.

2 Esdras 10:5 Then left I the meditations wherein I was, and spake to her in anger, saying,

V6 Thou foolish woman above all other, seest thou not our mourning, and what happeneth unto us?

V7 How that Sion our mother is full of all heaviness, and much humbled, mourning very sore?

V8 And now, seeing we all mourn and are sad, for we are all in heaviness, art thou grieved for one son?

He's telling her that she's foolish and selfish because she's reacting in such a way over one son.

2 Esdras 10:15 Now therefore keep thy sorrow to thyself, and bear with a good courage that which hath befallen thee.

V16 For if thou shalt acknowledge the determination of God to be just, thou shalt both receive thy son in time, and shalt be commended among women.

He told her to keep her sorrow to herself. When things like this happen in our lives it's for our good.

V24 Go thy way then into the city to thine husband.

Pride wants you to do things your way, but God tells us what to do when dealing with our emotions. We are the cause of our own suffering and we don't have to listen to every thought.

**When you think you're thinking,
you're actually listening...**



We have to keep our eyes on the prize. We'll have these thoughts pop in our head and take us all the way left.

Matthew 14:28 And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water.

V29 And he said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus.

V30 But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me.

V31 And immediately Jesus stretched forth *his* hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith,

wherefore didst thou doubt?

We can't take our eyes off of Christ and the laws. Don't think just do. Continue to keep your eyes on Christ.

We all have to get to the point where emotions don't sway us.

Psalms 119:165 Great peace have they which love thy law: and nothing shall offend them.

Nothing shall offend us and this is attainable.

When negative thoughts pop in your head we should be able to combat them like Christ.



Charity thinks no evil.

Zechariah 8:17 And let none of you imagine evil in your hearts against his neighbor; and love no false oath: for all these *are things* that I hate, saith the LORD

God hates when we evil surmise

Charity suffers long

Sirach 7:8 Bind not one sin upon another; for in one thou shalt not be unpunished.

Tough times teach us experience.

Charity does not seek her own

Philippians 2:3 *Let nothing be done* through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves.

God orders our steps

Charity endures all things

1 Corinthians 10:13 There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God *is* faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear *it*.

God will not give us more than we can handle

Charity supports all things

Hebrews 10:25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some *is*; but exhorting *one another*: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.

Time is getting short, sis, so spend as much time with your sisters as possible to be built up in these last days.
