Genesis 2:18 (KJV) And the LORD God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him.

- > The Most High decided it wasn't good for men to be by themselves on this earth.
- God said I'm going to make a person who's going to assist you, help you, listen to what you want done and help you make all your goals.

<u>1 Corinthians 11:9 KJV</u> Neither was the man created for the woman; but the woman for the man.

Man was not created for us women to tell them what to do.

- That is a worldly thing.
- > It means just the opposite; the woman was made for the man.
- > The woman was made to assist and to follow instruction.
- > We need to know our role as Israelite women.
- > The Most High says that the men are supposed to lead their households.

- > Your career is your family, first.
 - Not your schooling, nor your job.
- > First your husband and then the children.
- > Your goals should keep you motivated.
 - Are you meeting the criteria that keeps him happy?
 - Are you happy and are you caring for them in the right spirit?
- These goals need to be written down and every couple of months a selfexamination to check on your progress.
- What is your target?
- > What are your long-term goals in your marriage?

SISTER AVIYAH

Three principles of marriage:

- 1. Love
- 2. Commitment
- 3. Communication

<u>1 John 5:3 (KJV)</u> For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous.



1. Love

Part of us keeping the commandments is to obey those that have the rule over us.

- > It is to submit unto our own lords.
- > To be a help meet, a pillar of rest, and to see that we reverence our lord.

<u>1</u> Corinthians 7:39 (KJV) The wife is bound by the law as long as her husband liveth; but if her husband be dead, she is at liberty to be married to whom she will; only in the Lord.

To all my single sisters, proving sisters, and those that hope to be married.

- > We must understand that marriage is forever.
- ➢ It is not…
 - o when I am upset, or
 - o my feelings are hurt, or
 - I am not happy, or
 - $\circ~$ I just need a change of scenery then you are out the door.

<u>Sirach 36:24 (Apocrypha)</u> He that getteth a wife beginneth a possession, a help like unto himself, and a pillar of rest.

You become his possession.

- In all righteousness we should understand that as his possession, we are to serve our lords; being a help unto him.
- > The end says being a pillar of rest.
 - \circ Our men go through a lot as they begin to change and transform.
- 2. Communication

Ephesians 4:29 (KJV) Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers.

- Edifying meaning to develop.
- > Grace means having approval or favor or pleasing effect or appearance.
- > This is how we should communicate with our lords.
 - Mimicking our foremother Esther as she had eloquent speech with the King.

Obedience is one of my short-term goals.



Proverbs 31:28 (KJV) Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her.

Receiving praise from my lord is definitely one of my short-term goals.

- > My lord has a very high bar set for me.
- > His praise pushes me to a point of excellence.
- > He exercises the good in me where I may not necessarily see it in myself.
- To hear that I am doing a good job or, to tell me that he is proud of me, gives me an overwhelming sense of pride.
- > That praise keeps me motivated and wanting to be better.

Bishop Kani did a class where he says that the sisters say one thing and their lords are saying another.

> We should be looking for the reports from our lords.

<u>2 Kings 4:40 (KJV)</u> So they poured out for the men to eat. And it came to pass, as they were eating of the pottage, that they cried out, and said, O thou man of God, there is death in the pot. And they could not eat thereof.

I want to show the things I do at home to show my lord reverence and receive that righteous praise and attention we all desire from our lords.

Tobit 8:5 & 7 (Apocrypha) Then began Tobias to say, Blessed art thou, O God of our fathers, and blessed is thy holy and glorious name for ever; let the heavens bless thee, and all thy creatures. [7] And now, O Lord, I take not this my sister for lust but uprightly: therefore mercifully ordain that we may become aged together.


My long-term goal is to become aged together with my lord.

- ➢ Let's fix it.
- You want to nourish those beautiful things in your marriage so you can have that Sirach 40:23; best friends forever.

- Change your perspective, you might be the reason things go awry.
- Be peaceable, loving, sweet and kind, they will reciprocate that to you.

<u>1 Samuel 29:9 (KJV)</u> And Achish answered and said to David, I know that thou art good in my sight, as an angel of God: notwithstanding the princes of the Philistines have said, He shall not go up with us to the battle.

I see him as an angel of God.

➤ I like to remind my lord that he is *my* angel.



<u>1 Peter 3:7 (KJV)</u> Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered.

Find those joyful moments, build them, and make that a relationship goal.

> You can get your crowns together (the kingdom).

Ecclesiastes 9:9 (KJV) Live joyfully with the wife whom thou lovest all the days of the life of thy vanity, which he hath given thee under the sun, all the days of thy vanity: for that is thy portion in this life, and in thy labour which thou takest under the sun.

Live joyfully together.

- > Your lord made an investment, and you want him to feel he hit the jackpot.
- > Children watch their parents.
- > Teach the daughters to love their dads/husbands by your example.

Proverbs 31:10 (KJV) Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies.

I want to be his peace for lord's home.

<u>1</u> Corinthians 7:28 (KJV) But and if thou marry, thou hast not sinned; and if a virgin marry, she hath not sinned.

My goal is to love my man through hard times.

Romans 12:12 (KJV) Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;

We have to have a lot of patience in marriage.

- > When your lord is upset, you have to dig deep for patience.
 - o Do not go off and do not to belittle him.
 - He does not want to feel dismissed.
 - Take your time and listen to him.
- > Being patient will help him love you more.

James 1:19 (KJV) Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath:

Be able to listen and extract the problem.

- > Your body language is important.
- > Think before you speak.
- > Sit and listen, you have to be his peace.

Matthew 5:9 (KJV) Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

It is your job to be the peacemaker.

- Pray about the situation.
- > You can pray fast and leave it there.
- > The beauty of a woman cheers the countenance of a man.
- > When someone is offended you want to apologize.
- Comfort them through their storm.
