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Recap from Last Chat: Previous Chapters 27- 28 vs 1-40

- Certain tribes had the power to bring blessings and a certain portion was used to bring the curses to Israel based on the things they would do
- Verses 1-14 is talking about the blessings that will upon the nation of Israel

Verses 15-68 is talking about the curses that will upon the nation of Israel...

We discussed that some of the curses we were cursed in the field and in the city.

Cursed in the sugar, cotton, rubber fields etc.

Question: What made it a curse?

- Working long hours (from sunup to sundown)
- Only having Sunday off
- Women were raped
 - For instance, in the movie The Butler, Men had to watch their women go get raped

Question: What were some other curses that Israel met?

In Deuteronomy 28:37, we were called bywords



- Megan Thee Stallion has a song called savage
 - Why? Of all the words why is she calling herself a savage?
 - Is it not a coincidence. This was once a word to degrade us and now it's being used in songs to desensitize the meaning.
 - Trying to make savage sound like a good thing through the song
 - In the book "The Willie Lynch Letter" They called the black women savages
- Also, we call ourselves Bad B*** and Boss B***
 - In the Book "Willie Lynch Letter", when talking about breaking our mentality it was quoted "until you beat the last bit of B*** out of her".
 - We are holding on to these names the slave master put on us

In Deuteronomy 28:32 was our children would be taken away from us.

For example, if an incident occurs, CPS can come in and declare you to be unfitted to be a parent

Deuteronomy 28:42-68 (Please read)

Deuteronomy 28:42 (KJV) All thy trees and fruit of thy land shall the locust consume

- This here is an example of locust holes.
- Imagine in Egypt, when the locust was sent barreling under the ground, they messed up all of the crops

Deuteronomy 28:44 (KJV) He shall not lend to thee, and thou shalt not lend to him: he shall be the head, and thou shalt be the tail.



- They would own the banks
- An example of that is when Israel would try to get a house, business, car, etc. the other nations would have control over all that because they own bank
- So they would have the means to reign over us
 - We may be getting a higher interest rate
 - Using crafty council and putting different wording in contracts for the so-called African Americans to not understand different terminology



Deuteronomy 28:46 (KJV) And they shall be upon thee for a sign and for a wonder, and upon thy seed for ever.

- **O** What does it mean by that?
 - The curses would be on our children for generations to come
 - The curses are as a sign upon Israel
- For example, some sisters go to the hospital and are treated poorly, this needs to happen for us to have the reminder that we are Israel and in fact are living the curses
- **O** If these things do not happen to Israel, then we get high minded
 - Therefore, we need our "Jake Reminders"
- All of these curses happened due to us not having joy in the lord
 - So, when you catch yourself not being joyful in this truth, you need to correct that spirit
- Note: Also, with the sisters that are married we need to be cognoscente on the way we serve our lords
 - Believe it or not, some sisters have bad attitudes
 - We must be able to quickly fix our spirit especially during the High Holy days. So, we must remember

Deuteronomy 28:47 (KJV) Because thou servedst not the LORD thy God with joyfulness, and with gladness of heart, for the abundance of all things;

Deuteronomy 28:49 (KJV) Therefore shalt thou serve thine enemies which the LORD shall send against thee, in hunger, and in thirst, and in nakedness, and in want of all things: and he shall put a yoke of iron upon thy neck, until he have destroyed thee.

- This goes back to the food stamps, WIC, and the clothes we wear
- We are completely dependent on the other nations as we were not dependent on The Most High.

Deuteronomy 28:49 (KJV) The LORD shall bring a nation against thee from far, from the end of the earth, as swift as the eagle flieth; a nation whose tongue thou shalt not understand;

- **O** It mentions that a symbol
- Esau used the Eagle as their symbol and would come against us

Deuteronomy 28:50 (KJV) A nation of fierce countenance, which shall not regard the person of the old, nor shew favour to the young:

• An example of that, having someone as young as two (2) years old to the elderly picking cotton



Deuteronomy 28:52 (KJV) And he shall besiege thee in all thy gates, until thy high and fenced walls come down, wherein thou trustedst, throughout all thy land: and he shall besiege thee in all thy gates throughout all thy land, which the LORD thy God hath given thee.

- This is going into history where Moses is prophesying about Israel.
 - For instance, Lords of the Rings, where they have those high walls or Game of Thrones
 >> we put our trust in those high fenced walls

Deuteronomy 28:53 (KJV) And thou shalt eat the fruit of thine own body, the flesh of thy sons and of thy daughters, which the LORD thy God hath given thee, in the siege, and in the straitness, wherewith thine enemies shall distress thee:

• We were at one point eating our children when we had nothing else

Deuteronomy 28:54 (KJV) So that the man that is tender among you, and very delicate, his eye shall be evil toward his brother, and toward the wife of his bosom, and toward the remnant of his children which he shall leave:

- At one point our brothers did not treat one another the way they did, the violence was not always there.
 - How did we get to the point where we can just pull out a gun and kill each other or to even hurt one another?

Deuteronomy 28:56 (KJV) The tender and delicate woman among you, which would not adventure to set the sole of her foot upon the ground for delicateness and tenderness, her eye shall be evil toward the husband of her bosom, and toward her son, and toward her daughter,

- At one point we were tender women and were not rough in our speech and/or actions
 - We must pray to repent over that spirit and having a more delicate spirit. As this spirit does not come off over night
- "Ruby Bridges" if you watch the women in that movie and their mannerism
- **O** We were delicate, and we should practice on getting back to the way they were.

Deuteronomy 28:57 (KJV) And toward her young one that cometh out from between her feet, and toward her children which she shall bear: for she shall eat them for want of all things secretly in the siege and straitness, wherewith thine enemy shall distress thee in thy gates.

- She will be evil to her husband as the curses say
 - But us women must learn to stay in our lane
 - There is power in being a woman and feminine as we can give birth and provide nourishment



- Women have power to bring light into the house
- Also talking about she shall siege and straitness >>> she will hate her children, as the children will need their mother no matter the age
 - This is a curse that was put upon us

Deuteronomy 28:64 (KJV) And the LORD shall scatter thee among all people, from the one end of the earth even unto the other; and there thou shalt serve other gods, which neither thou nor thy fathers have known, even wood and stone

O Examples include serving in both Christianity and Islam

Deuteronomy 28:66 (KJV) And thy life shall hang in doubt before thee; and thou shalt fear day and night, and shalt have none assurance of thy life

- Doubt our people were hung for any reason
- Lynching's are still taking place until this day and that goes back to verse 46 to make Israel remember
 - If the hangings stopped then Israel would forget that this pertained to them

Deuteronomy 28:68 (KJV) And the LORD shall bring thee into Egypt again with ships, by the way whereof I spake unto thee, Thou shalt see it no more again: and there ye shall be sold unto your enemies for bondmen and bondwomen, and no man shall buy you

- O Deuteronomy 28:68... it's a hook line and it's not much denying that
- The Amalek "so-called" Jewish people DO NOT read Deuteronomy because there is a lot of truth in this chapter
 - Jewish people could never connect with this, therefore they do not read it because it has nothing to do with them.
 - It used to be punishable by death for reading this. This all because they knew at one point, we will wake up
