

Israel's troubles began later when a counsellor to King Ahasuerus, Haman (Edomite), was offended at Mordecai's refusal to bow to him.


Haman connived a plan to convince the king the Jews were a wicked and rebellious people who needed to be exterminated.

## Great Gift Idea for Purim

Try this fun and easy gift idea with your parent's help. Clay Bowls are a fun, expensive, and simple craft you can do with your parents. All you will need is Air Dry Clay and Paint. Once you're done, decorate it to your heart's content. This activity will leave you excited to make more and will serve as a great gift for Purim.

### Make A Clay Bowl

1. Roll the clay into a ball
2. Stick thumbs into the center of the ball, pinching the sides to make a hollow (you're making a bowl shape, not a donut).
3. Flatten out the bottom of the ball to make a nice flat surface for the bowl (so it will sit sturdily on a table without risk of it falling)
4. Let air dry or bake dry depending on the type of clay you are using.
5. Use acrylic paint to decorate the pot however you like or leave it natural
6. Let dry
